Psychiatrist

Our Behavioral Health Services Division is currently offering an employment opportunity for a Board Certified Psychiatrist to join our provider team. The ideal candidate will bring with them their experience in providing quality psychiatric services as well as their expertise working in an atmosphere where integrated healthcare is key.

Lane County Behavioral Health is the comprehensive Community Mental Health Provider that currently provides a broad array of services to the 1500 adult and child clients it serves at any given time. Typical services include psychiatric evaluation, medication management, case management, individual and group therapy, skill training, consultation, crisis stabilization and community outreach.

Lane County Behavioral Health is under the umbrella of the FQHC and provides an integrated, holistic, multi-disciplinary team approach to individuals with moderate to severe mental and emotional difficulties. We demonstrate through our actions a respect for our clients, a belief in their ability to achieve recovery and appreciation for diversity and individual differences. We have primary care services here on site, with the Clinic being the Medical Home for many of our enrolled clients. We also have an onsite pharmacy and laboratory drawing station. We are working to fully integrate a full array of health services into our clinic for our enrolled individuals. We are currently a site for the RAISE (Recovery After Initial Schizophrenic Episode) research project funded by NIMH which is testing an early intervention program for first onset psychotic disorders, and are in the process of moving toward implantation of a Feedback Informed Treatment approach which has been recognized by SAMHSA as a "best practice". In the next year we are anticipating adding chemical dependency treatment to our array of services. In addition to traditional mental health services, individuals are offered the opportunity to avail themselves to a wide array of alternative, non-traditional mental health approaches, including art therapy, movement therapy, alpha stimulation, light boxes, DBT, wellness groups, activity therapy, outreach and wraparound services, groups for co-occurring disorders, and skills training of various kinds.

Lane County is generally regarded as having the most comprehensive public mental health system in Oregon, and Lane County Behavioral Health Services is one of 16 public mental health providers in a system that is characterized by excellent partnerships, well coordinated care, and strong communication among providers. Lane County Behavioral Health has a large, dedicated medical staff consisting of psychiatrists (both adult and child), Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioners (adult and child), Mental Health nurses, and RNs, who function as part of a treatment team with clinician case managers (Mental Health Specialists) and primary care physicians and nurse practitioners.
