



LANE COUNTY PARKS RULES

These rules are contained in Lane Code, Sections 6.500 – 6.595

Park Rangers have the authority to write citations for non-compliance of these rules.

These rules are established to help keep you and others safe in the park, to promote an enjoyable visit, and to protect our parks' resources.

Fires: Fires and disposal of charcoal are permitted only in BBQ pits or receptacles provided. Portable cooking stoves may be used in a safe manner, so long as they do not cause damage to park facilities. Fires must be attended at all times and must be completely extinguished prior to departure.

Weapons: No person may use any weapon capable of harming persons, wildlife, or property.

Hunting and Fishing: Hunting or trapping of game or non-game animals is not permitted. Fishing is permitted in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.

Destruction of Property or Property Removal: Defacing, damaging, destroying or removing any item or substance from a Lane County park that is prohibited.

Dogs and Other Pets: Dogs and other pets must be kept on a leash under six (6) feet in length and must not be permitted to run at large. The pet owner is responsible for disposing of any wastes produced by the pet.

Sales: Concessions, advertising, soliciting, or selling any good in a Lane County park is prohibited.

Vehicle Operation and Parking: All vehicles, including motorcycles and trailers, must be parked in designated parking spaces. Vehicles, including motor, trail and mountain bikes, ORV's and ATV's, must be operated only on roads and parking lots. Vehicles are not allowed over curbs, on grass or in picnic areas. The maximum speed limit through the parks is 15 mph.

Creating a Disturbance: Radios, tape decks, car stereos, or other sound producing devices must be operated so as not to be plainly audible from a distance of 50 feet.

Swimming: Swimming, wading, or other water play is not permitted in areas posted "No Swimming." Sunbathing is not permitted on boat courtesy docks.

Camping or Overnight Parking: Camping or overnight parking is permitted only in campgrounds or according to designated temporary areas assigned by Parks staff and only up to 14 days in any 30 day period.

After Hours: No person may enter or remain in any Lane County Park Day Use Area between dusk and dawn. Moorage holders and their guests may stay overnight in designated marina parking areas only and with authorized Lane County Moorage Annual Parking Pass.

Closed Areas: No person may enter any Lane County park or portion thereof which has been closed to public access. No person may operate a vehicle in any Lane County park or portion thereof which has been closed to vehicles.

Garbage and Litter: All trash, garbage or other refuse must be placed in the receptacles provided. Dumping of household garbage is strictly prohibited.

Horses: Horses are permitted on roadways or designated equestrian trails only.

Alcoholic Beverages: Serving alcoholic beverages to minors or to persons who are visibly intoxicated is a violation of State law and is prohibited in Lane County Parks. Selling of alcohol is strictly prohibited. Individuals of legal drinking age may consume alcohol in a park

Special Use Permits: If you wish to engage in an activity that is contrary to the rules stated above, you may apply for a Special Use Permit which will be reviewed by Parks Staff and *may* allow for temporary and event-specific exceptions to these rules. Permits are also required for special events and special uses of the park areas. For additional information, please call Lane County Parks at 541-682-2000.
