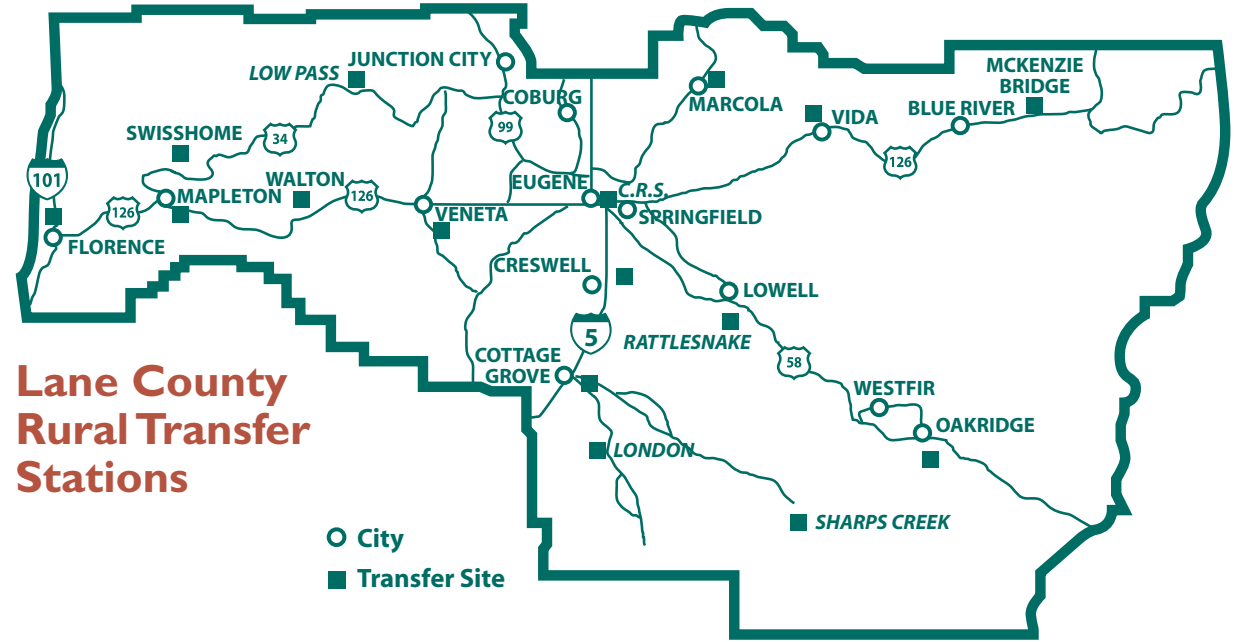

Rural Recycling Guide

Free Recycling Services

It is against State Law to put the following items in the garbage: Motor Oil, Lead-acid Batteries, Appliances, Auto Tires, Computers, Laptops and Televisions.

Tips for Self Haulers

If you're coming in to visit one of our 16 transfer stations, keep these tips in mind:

- Load your vehicle garbage first and recycling last so you can easily drop off recyclables first and get the \$1 credit slip before you dump.
- Cover your load. If you show up at our sites with an uncovered load, your fees could double. This is to keep our roadsides free of litter.
- Garbage costs money to dispose of. Talk to the fee collector or recycler at the transfer site and ask if they have any more tips on reducing your garbage.
- Pesticides, chemical cleaners, glues, and solvents are dangerous in the trash, Call 541-682-3111 to make a free disposal appointment or to learn about annual rural collection days.

| Materials | Accepted | Preparation | Location |

| Aluminum | Aluminum trays, foil, and cans | Magnets do not stick to aluminum, Rinse | All sites |
| Antifreeze | Antifreeze only. Household only. No farm or business may use these sites. | Store in unbreakable container. Original containers not recyclable | All sites |
| Computer/ Televisions | 7 items or less. No floor standing copiers | NO speakers, no reel-to-reel, no packaging, no cases, covers, wraps or boxes | see next page |
| Corrugated cardboard | Corrugated cardboard (wavy middle layer), brown paper bags | Break down and flatten all boxes | All sites |
| Glass bottles and jars | Brown, clear & green glass bottles only. No drinking, pyrex, or window glass | Rinse and separate by color. Labels are okay. DO NOT BREAK | All sites |
| High-grade paper | Writing, computer, & fax paper in white and pastel colors | Don't need to remove staples, windows, or adhesives | Cottage Grove, Glenwood, Florence, Veneta |
| Household batteries | All button and rechargeable Alkaline, NiCad, Lithium, Silver Oxide, and Mercury batteries | Modern alkaline batteries AAA-D okay to toss in garbage | All sites |
| Juice & milk cartons | Milk cartons & juice boxes | Rinse and remove plastic lids | All sites |
| Lead-acid batteries | All types & sizes of auto and other lead-acid batteries | None | All sites |
| Low-grade paper | Mail, cereal & shoe boxes, paper egg cartons, bright colored paper, wrapping paper, & phone books | Don't need to remove staples, windows, or adhesives. No cups, plates or paper towels. | All sites |
| Magazines | Magazines & inserts | Remove plastic packaging | All sites |
| Motor oil & filters | Motor oil & oil filters. Household only. No farm or business may use these sites. | Store in unbreakable containers. Original containers are not recyclable | All sites |
| Newspaper | Newspapers and inserts | None | All sites |
| Plastic bottles, tubs, jars ONLY | Look for shape not the number. No trays, or other shaped containers. No containers 6oz. or less | Rinse and remove lids. Lids are garbage | All sites |
| Plastic bags and sheeting | Plastic grocery bags, vegetable bags, bread bags, soil, mulch, pellet bags, 6pk rings. | Must be clean and dry; turn inside out and shake. No ziplock bags, no food or dirt contamination, bubble wraps must have air removed | All sites |
| Plastic milk jugs | Plastic milk jugs | Rinse and remove lids. Lids are garbage | All sites |
| Scrap metal | All metals; steel, brass, copper; & other scrap including appliances (non-cooling units), toasters, water heaters, bed frames, microwaves, lawn mowers. | Items must contain over 75% scrap metal. Containers must be visibly punctured from all sides. Drain all fluids | All sites |
| Sharps | Needles, scalpels, & other sharp instruments | Pack in rigid, red, sealed container (red or orange laundry detergent bottles are okay) | All sites |
| Tin cans | Tin & steel cans | Rinse! Labels and lids okay | All sites |

Recovered Items With Required Fees

| Materials | Accepted | Preparation | Fee (Subject to change) |

| Appliances | Refrigerators, air conditioners, freezers, & heat pumps. All units that contain freon. No commercial units. All sites | Remove any food. Do not cut cords or drain freon. | \$15 each |
| Propane tanks | All types (maximum size, 10 gal.) All Sites | None | Up to 10 gal-\$4 |
| Tires | Passenger Tires only. Maximum 22 inch diameter (All tires measured at rim). All Sites | No commercial quantities (+10) and no commercial purpose tires | Up to 17" tire-\$2, with rim \$3; 17-22" tire-\$6, with rim \$10 |
| Wood waste | Lumber; shakes, pressboard, pegboard, plywood, lath, pallets, panels, & wood furniture. Nails and screws are okay. Cottage Grove and Florence only | No railroad ties. No hardware larger than your thumb. No foam core or formica or plastic. | 3 cans-3 cu yd-\$13.50 Over 3 cu yd-\$7 per yd Commercial only-\$62 per ton |
| Yard debris | Grass, brush, leaves, garden waste, limbs up to 20" dia. Cottage Grove and Florence only | No garbage or plastic bags | Same as wood waste |

TVs, computers, monitors and laptops

are prohibited in the garbage. Lane County collects this material for FREE at five transfer stations (Glenwood, Cottage Grove, Florence, Veneta, and Vida).

Lane County **CANNOT** accept:

- more than 7 items
- floor standing copiers (any item of similar size),
- dismantled units or parts.

Due to the high costs of recycling certain items, the items at left can be recycled at rural recycling sites for a fee. According to State law, tires, TVs, computers and appliances are not allowed to be disposed of as garbage.

Did you know...

- Making **paper** from recycled fiber generates 75% less air pollution.
- **Aluminum** made from recycled cans uses 95% less energy than if made from virgin (bauxite) ore.
- The amount of **tin** ore left in the world will last only 31 years if use grows at projected rates.
- One pint of used **motor oil** can create a poisonous slick one-acre in diameter.
- A typical **auto battery** contains up to 20 pounds of lead and up to one gallon of corrosive sulfuric acid.
- 30% of municipal solid waste is made up of **packaging**.
- Avoiding over packaged items saves you money at the grocery store and at the disposal site.
